This expo is my deliberate attempt to focus on positive themes including everyday things that make me happy to think about. Each painting features a simple theme that is surrounded by web-like calligraphy that is really the word "love" written over and over again with each "o" letter filled in with colorful paint.

Writing love repeatedly in this way is a sort of brainwashing that puts me into a peaceful meditative state. I leave the central subject in black and white to convey the message to the viewer that these are images in my imagination, and are meant to represent an ideal situation in my head... they are not all meant to be a representation of my actual daily reality.

Here are a few the painting titles: I Love a Rose, I Love Music, I Love the Idea of a Large United Family, I Love Football, I Love the Idea of Nurturing Generations, I Love Kissing, I Love Simple Signs of Affection, I Love Having Dinner With My Family ...



Oh, what joy!

A rebel at heart, driven by a sense of justice and affection, and above all, a princess of the heart, the happily Pop, colorful figure of our walls, Delphine van Saksen-Coburg has been regularly returning to show her work at the Galerie Guy Pieters since 2006. This loyalty, on both sides, signifies a kind of attachment to the fundamental values of our society, which too often breaks its moorings for no reason.

This artist lives her life radiating in diversity. She doesn't play at playing. She plays by creating what keeps her standing and guides her.

We know where she comes from and how hard her journey was to make her voice heard. Case closed. Since then, she has been going her own way with the joy of quiet mornings in her studio. Palette wrapped in colors and drips, the landmark exudes the serenity of the tomorrows that enchant her. And they enchant her, because they stir her with words that, if they are also, more or less, the same, are, like her dreams, of those realities that she intends to share with the vivacity of laughter that galvanizes her and the satisfaction of new daring.

"Y a d'la joie!" sang Trenet, the singing madman, to the rhythm of those holidays for everyone - in the time of the Popular Front around 1936 - that he enchanted with his exhilarating refrains. In this new exhibition, Delphine van Saksen-Coburg answers the question "What makes me happy?" And she goes about it with her words that sing, of love and fresh water, one and the other intertwined in wild and joyful sarabandes of lines and colors. Of materials that stand out on thick canvases that bear witness to the durability of her vows and attachments to a life that surprises her more and more beautifully.

"Love," repeated from work to work, but also in the interlacing of her canvases rounded with mysteries and scattered magic, arranged between each other as so many chromatic and light gallops that delight the eye and offer peace for the soul.

"In this moment - she says - I am in love!" A light blouse all aureoled with her most spontaneous vocabulary, a trademark of a beautiful and tall woman, without frills or prerogatives, jovial, spontaneous, inhabited by a long-awaited new breath of life, pushing desires that drive an artist to sublimate herself, Delphine will have prepared in the fever of expectations her expo at Galerie Guy Pieters.

Monumental canvases, on the one hand, and smaller ones on the other, the artist, a new deal, breaks the rhythm of words, dots and colors by, here and there, a familiar scene that she traces in black and white. It is about hands that join, fists that agree, a child's hand clinging to an adult's. Of family scenes. With the idea of having a large, close family. All this in a halo of colors.

"Children touch me enormously. They are so vulnerable. And the act of 'touching' means a lot to me. I missed it so much."

Elsewhere, there is the question of football. "I love football. It is a sport that can bring together children and adults. We can play it all day long. This sport can make everyone happy."

A universal symbol, there is the representation of fingers that, joined together, form a heart... "My new paintings show simple things that can make us happy. I try to show that affection, gestures are so important in life."


Obsessed with work, which is made more enjoyable by the complicity of Jim, her companion and father of her two children, Delphine laughs heartily. She, who loves tenderness, respect for others, and the conviviality of encounters, enjoys her own daring.

"People don't know my figurative work - a still life, roses, for example - but I wanted to surprise around the repetition of the word 'Love'." Painted in acrylic, even on their sides, her canvases soothe or color her words, her refrains.


Decorative? And why not! In a corner of the studio, a colored neon sign reminds us that she has never been afraid to experiment... "I have always created with my guts!"

And, what's new, her little jewels - gold, diamonds, rubies, of guaranteed provenance - give another dimension to her adventure: from the infinitely large - canvases of more than two meters - to sculpture in miniature. And to conclude: "Writing Love all day long, It Makes Me Happy!"

Why I Made These Precious Mini-Artworks

I wanted to express how love is precious to me and should be treasured. Hence, I created these tiny sculptures using precious and durable materials—gold, diamond and ruby.

In a world where people move around a lot, we travel across continents for new challenges and experiences. In all this change, the idea of having a symbolic treasure, a small work of art, really connects. It becomes a link between past, present, and future—a comforting reminder of lasting love and special memories.

Each mini-artwork is housed in a handmade velvet heart box, which symbolizes warm and comforting love. As they're passed from loved one to loved one, they can carry the memories of special times and deep connections. Even though they're small, they're really important, staying close to us throughout life's journey, whether worn close to the heart or displayed in its open velvet box. In this way, they go beyond being just jewelry.

Each artwork and box are handcrafted in Antwerp. Each piece is engraved on the back with it's number and signed "Delphine de Saxe-Cobourg 2023" along with "Crafted in Antwerp David Gotlib."

The diamonds and ruby are exclusively of natural origin and untreated. They have been purchased from legitimate sources not involved in funding conflict, in compliance with United Nations Resolutions and corresponding national laws.

These diamonds are conflict-free and adhere to the World Diamond Council Guidelines. The 18k Rose gold is from recycled sources.

Delphine van Saksen-Coburg is an Anglo-Belgian artist. Delphine grew up in London and worked there as an artist until 2003, when she moved to Brussels to set up a new studio. In addition to her gallery and museum exhibitions, she has successfully worked on art-related projects with several global companies including Coca-Cola, Bic, Absolut, the Red Cross and the Bicester Collection.

Delphine has earned a voice in the European art world as a non-conformist statement artist and colourist. She is known for creating multimedia artworks overflowing with colour, texture and humour that address universal themes.

From painting, video, neon sculpture and metal design pieces, her artworks are vibrant, playful and quirky. They are capable of lovingly inspiring the dispossessed, while also abruptly bringing the powerful and prideful back to reality. Issues of identity, power and justice often inspire Delphine's work. Part of her artistic motivation is to offer the viewer a chance to see the bright side of life.

Delphine's explicit use of words and language make her messages very straightforward, while her use of colour and composition leaves space for whimsy and irony.


